The role of the CCM Coordinators on International Cooperation and Assistance

- CCM Article 6
 - States Parties have the right to seek and receive assistance
 - States Parties with capacity shall provide technical, material and financial assistance to States Parties affected by cluster munitions



The role of the CCM Coordinators on International Cooperation and Assistance (contd)

- Dubrovnik Action Plan Action 5.1 para 38(b)
 - Agreement to share information and good practices, technologies, resources and expertise to implement the CCM
- Dubrovnik Action Plan Action 5.2 para 39
 - Agreement to communicate challenges and needs for cooperation and assistance for the full implementation of CCM obligations





The role of the CCM Coordinators on International Cooperation and Assistance (contd)

- CCM Coordinators facilitate communication between CCM States Parties of their challenges and needs, and the sharing of information and good practices, technologies, resources and expertise
- Effective communication of needs of affected States is the first step toward establishing successful Country Coalitions





- Problem
 - More to be done to enhance communication between affected and donor States
 - Needs and challenges are not being communicated, or have been communicated with little or no response
- Solution
 - A closed meeting between affected and donor States to discuss challenges on cooperation and assistance



- Objectives
 - A new, additional channel for raising unmet needs and challenges
 - Help affected states understand how to access assistance more effectively and help donor states understand difficulties of accessing assistance
 - Provide the foundations for the establishment of enhanced partnerships between affected and donor states, such as Country Coalitions



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- Questions for affected States
 - Key obstacles to meeting clearance and/or stockpile destruction deadlines
 - Key obstacles to addressing the needs of victims
 - Specific ways for donor states to assist
 - Obstacles to communicating needs to donor states, and how these might be addressed
 - How available channels of information within the CCM might be better used



- Questions for donor States
 - Priority issues to address through international cooperation and assistance
 - How affected states should communicate with donors to secure funding or technical assistance
 - Obstacles to providing international cooperation and assistance, and how to address these
 - How available channels of information within the CCM might be better used



- Questions for all
 - Potential of initiatives like Country Coalitions to enhance international cooperation and assistance?
 - What can Coordinators do better to enhance international cooperation and assistance?
 - What actions or steps should the Coordinators include in the next (2020) Action Plan?





- Key points raised
 - Major obstacles to meeting deadlines: lack of funding, technical expertise and resources; and lack of national will
 - Key areas in which donors might assist: provision of funding, expertise and resources; building capacity for national ownership; direct engagement with authorities, NGOs and areas on the ground
 - Key to securing assistance: detailed information on progress, obstacles and the specific assistance necessary to achieve completion



- Key points raised (contd)
 - Need for better coordination amongst donors to ensure that assistance was distributed to all states in need, not just those with higher profile problems
 - Need for Coordinators to find further ways to help affected and donor states communicate needs and ways to access funds, such as separate meetings





- Key points raised (contd)
 - An individualised approach like Country Coalitions offers significant potential for accelerating progress
 - Enables more targeted assistance accounting for specific and different circumstances faced by each country
 - Should be made the key tool for international cooperation and assistance, including in next Action Plan
 - Effectiveness depends on direct engagement on the ground and ongoing dialogue between partners
