

# Meeting of the Friends of the President of the 1MSP to the CCM 30 November 2010 Minutes and action points

#### Summary

Following the 1MSP to the CCM, the first meeting of Friends was held, Tuesday 30 November. The meeting confirmed Friends and respective areas of work, considered a proposed first draft of architecture paper, and considered possible outcomes of the 2MSP. The meeting was opened and chaired by Ambassador Yong from the Lao Presidency with facilitation of agenda items 2-4 by the President's Executive Coordinator. The main elements discussed and various action points agreed are set out below and per the agenda annexed.

#### **Debrief on 1MSP**

Lao PDR presented the outcomes of the 1MSP, noting the views expressed by most, that this had been a highly successful meeting and that Lao PDR was very pleased. Ambassador Yong thanked all of the Friends of the President, CMC, UN and ICRC for their support in delivering this success and thanked them for all work they had done. Other states, the CMC and ICRC also praised the meeting, its outcomes, the strong sense of teamwork and role of the Presidency and the Lao Government.

#### **Draft architecture**

A food for thought paper on the future implementation architecture and an intersessional work programme was presented, for discussion and further elaboration as a basis for expected decisions at the 2MSP. The proposals relate to 1) an annual intersessional meeting for up to five days; 2) a series of 'working groups' with 'co-chairs' or 'coordinators'; 3) a 'coordination committee' involving the 'co-chairs' / 'coordinators', President, President-designate, civil society and international organisations; and, 4) a 'Convention Support Office' to fulfil functions outlined in support of the implementation of the convention. Consensus was reached with regards to the need for an independent support mechanism reporting directly to States Parties. Discussions were not exhaustive, further discussions are needed with regards to the organisation of work among 'working groups'.

Thematic roles and leads of Friends, interim period 1MSP – 2MSP; organisation of work Ambassador Yong confirmed the list of Friends who agrees to continue in their roles of coordinating the thematic work as follows:

- Norway (general status and operation)
- Germany (stockpile destruction)
- Australia (clearance)
- Austria (victim assistance)
- South Africa (cooperation and assistance)
- Japan (universalisation)
- Belgium (transparency and reporting)
- New Zealand (national implementation measures)

The Presidency agreed to reconfirm with Austria, Japan and Mexico given that they were not present and conduct consultations with other states that have expressed interest in contributing to the work of the group of Friends under the Lao presidency. In addition, Ireland remains engaged in the work and Canada will confirm its ability to continue its work



with regard to the implementation architecture prior to the next meeting. As the number of areas of work indicated in the decisions of the 1<sup>st</sup> Meeting of States Parties is 8, additional Friends were requested to support the work of the Friends with specified area of work and actively engage in the discussions to help formulate consensus in preferred way forward. Additional discussion needed on the expectations of Friends, i.e. how further work will be conducted will be subject for the next meeting of Friends.

#### **Outcomes of 2MSP**

To help guide the priorities and work forward in advance of the intersessional work programme outlined for June 2011 in preparation for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Meeting of States Parties Friends discussed anticipated outcomes areas of the 2MSP including:

- a report on progress and challenges in fulfilling the Vientiane Action Plan;
- decisions on the future architecture of the CCM;
- location and presidency of 3MSP and,
- a possible political declaration deferred to the host country to decide.

#### Plans for 2MSP

Lebanon thanked the Friends, the Lao Presidency, CMC, UNDP, ICRC for the support and goodwill they have shown towards Lebanon and its offer to host and preside over the 2MSP. Lebanon noted it will work closely with the Lao Presidency and wishes to continue the good atmosphere and teamwork that led to a successful 1MSP. A first planning mission to Lebanon is set for the week of 13 December at which partners will start looking at the cooperation for and organisation of the 2MSP.

#### **Action Points**

- Revision of the food-for-thought paper on the future implementation architecture and an intersessional work programme based on feedback received and in time for the next Friends meeting tentatively set for end of Jan/beginning of Feb 2011.
- Presidency to hold an informal open-ended consultation in Geneva following the next Friends meeting in order to 1) introduce and inform of the new list of Friends, 2) outline the process of work towards the 2MSP, 3) circulate a revised draft paper on architecture and 4) inform on the future information platform for accessing information with regards to the work on the Convention. The Presidency also noted that it is working on a draft agenda for the intersessional meetings in June and would welcome input from Friends. Also that the Presidency would (re)confirm additional Friends.
- Executive Coordinator to circulate minutes to Friends for comments before
  uploading to the public domain at <a href="www.clusterconvention.org">www.clusterconvention.org</a> as an intermediate
  means of ensuring transparency and accessibility with regards to information and
  process; and to draw up a calendar for 2011 with a list of tentative dates for Friends
  meetings, informal briefings and other key events.
